Hints, Tips & Reminders

You must also plant what caterpillars (larval forms) will eat. Choose host plants for the butterflies in this area. (Asclepias 'Milkweed' for monarchs. Butterflies sip. Caterpillars chew.

Red is a favored color.

Plant in large groups, not singly. Plant same or similar colors in the group.

Plant in full sun.

Garden should be out of the path of the west wind, or somehow protected from the west wind.

Plan to achieve full-season flowering.

Do not use a herbicide, pesticide, or any chemical lawn applications in the proximity.

Incorporate rocks and brick, flat stone or gravel paths. Butterflies like to bask on warm stone in the early morning sun.

Develop a mud puddle in a sunny spot of the garden.

Add a serving of soft, mushy fruit. They love it! Particularly juicy fruits like watermelon and mushy banana.

Keep a shallow dish of sugar water (1:4) in the garden. Put a scrungee pad in the center so butterflies can land on it and slurp.
