Suggestions for the Cutting Garden

Cutting gardens can be a separate, sunny area in your yard specifically for the purpose of having flowers to enhance your home or give as gifts. A cutting garden usually consists of annuals, perennials, foliage and even herbs. The cutting garden can be laid out in the simplest, most practical manner. Some suggestions:

- Plant the perennials in rows like a vegetable garden. The tallest flowers should not shade the shorter ones
- Choose a site that receives at least one-half day of sun
- Prepare the soil, dig in the compost and rake it free of rocks
- Use the cutting garden also as an experimental station to find out what certain perennials do before planting them in your garden
- Cut flowers in the morning or evening
- Use a sharp pair of scissors or pruning shears
- Remove foliage from the base of stems
- Place cut flowers into a container of warm water
- Make another clean diagonal cut to base of stem as the arrangement is created
- Cut flower food can be added to the water to prolong the life of the flowers
- Deadhead any flowers you don't cut for inside. This will help promote more flowers.
